

AN EARLY START TO SAVING



If you don't teach your kids about money, someone else will. Is that a risk you're willing to take? Didn't think so! Here are a few easy steps to ensure your kiddos are starting off on the right track.

- Discuss Wants vs. Needs The first step on this journey is distinguishing the difference between wants and needs. Explain to your child that needs include basics like food and shelter, clothing, healthcare, and even education. Wants are all the extras – a new toy, the yummy candy bar they spotted at the check-out line or maybe tickets to the latest big movie at the theatre.
- Allow Them to Earn Their Own Money The Internet is full of endless ageappropriate chore ideas for ages two and up. Create a chore list for your child and allow them to earn their own money each week. Allowing your children to earn and save money at an early age gives them the opportunity to learn just how to use it.

Pro Tip Let your child to see their savings! A clear bank of some sort will allow them to see their money grow, rather than just wondering about what is inside.

Set Goals and Track Spending – For a child, saving with no purpose may seem pointless. They need a 'why' to stay motivated! Help your little one set a savings goal for big purchases. If they make \$5 each week and are saving for a toy that costs \$25, how long will it take to reach that goal? Encourage your kids to track spending by writing down each purchase. This allows them to see where exactly their money is going and gives a good look at spending patterns.




IF YOU MADE A MILLION


